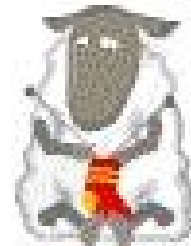
President's Message

September Program

Perfect Cable

Bring the following to the meeting:

1. Sport or worsted weight light color plain yarn
2. Knitting needles matching the yarn
3. Cable needle or safety pin

Homework:

With the above yarn and needles, cast on 8 sts.

Knit garter stitch for 6 rows (3 ridges)

Stay turned for the rest at the meeting



September Pattern:



● Jimmy Beans Scarf to Throw

The last pattern for the Jimmy Beans scarf series has been posted. The idea is that you can use the 9 free patterns to knit scarves or you can knit all 9 and seam them together into a throw. The pattern calls for worsted weight yarn and #10 needles.

Someone's In The Kitchen With . . .

Apricot Squares

8 tablespoons butter (1/4 lb.)

1-1/3 cups flour

1/4 c sugar

1/2 pounds apricots

2 eggs

1 c light brown sugar

salt

Combine butter, 1 cup flour, granulated sugar until pebbly. Press into a 8" buttered square pan. Bake for 15 minutes at 350°.

*Chop fruit - combine eggs, brown sugar 1/3 c flour and salt. Sprinkle apricots on baked crust and pour egg mixture over apricots.

Bake until lightly browned, soft in middle approx. 30 minutes.

*You can combine the apricots with the egg mixture and pour it over the crust.

Tangle-free

When knitting Intarsia with several colours, you can end up with your yarn in a tangled mess. Try punching holes in the lid of a shoe box and threading one yarn through each hole. Tape the lid on and you're tangle-free. I find this much more manageable than bobbins.
